## ARRIVAL

**Crossing guards, playground supervisors, teachers and cafeteria staff do not begin work responsibilities prior to 7:30 a.m. and at 8:30 a.m. on late start days. Students should not arrive at school alone before then.**

Students need to be dropped off at the playground before the first bell rings. Only students who are accompanied by an adult may enter the front doors prior to 7:50 a.m.

## STUDENT DISMISSAL

The office receives several phone calls every day to let students know about after school plans for transportation. Each call is then relayed to students and teachers via intercom. These calls create excessive interruptions in instructional time during reading and math blocks. It also consumes a great amount of secretarial time. **Please make arrangements for how and where your child will be going after school BEFORE leaving home each day. Any changes need to be communicated via note to the teacher.** If there is an *emergency* change, please notify the office so they can notify the teacher via intercom.

If you are picking up your student(s) after school, please pick them up at the parking areas on Bristol and Clinton.

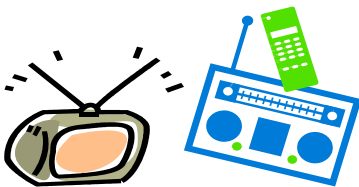

## **Attendance**

**It is extremely important that students maintain regular school attendance. Students who are regularly late or absent miss important instruction. It is the principal's, vice principal's and teacher's job to track and report attendance concerns to parents and local authorities. Please keep this in mind if you receive an attendance letter. By law, any student that misses four days in four weeks is considered truant. Additionally, the law states that school agents (the principal), not parents, excuse absences.**

## GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE ILL STUDENT

### When Should I Keep My Child Home?

Student's Symptoms/Diagnosed Illness	Student May Return to School When:
Fever greater than 100.5 (orally)	Temperature below 100.5 degrees (orally) for a minimum of 24 hours without the use of Tylenol or other fever-reducing medicine
Rash with or without fever – new or sudden onset	Rash disappears. Written or phone consent from health care provider to school nurse
Weepy (fluid or pus filled) skin lesions	Discharge must be gone or the student must have a written or phone consent from health care provider to school nurse. Opened sores must be covered.
Vomiting	Symptom free for 24 hours
Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in one day	Symptom free for 24 hours
Cough: deep, barking, congested or productive of colored mucous/phlegm	Symptom free or have a written or phone consent from health care provider to school nurse
Strep throat diagnosed by health care provider	<b>Must</b> have been on antibiotics for 24 hours
After an illness of 2 or more weeks, surgery or other change in health status	Written instruction from health care provider and parent regarding medication or special health needs provided to the school nurse
Pink/Red eye: irritated eyes that are tearing, sensitive to light, with puffy lids and colored drainage	Symptom free, or on antibiotics for 24 hours, or cleared by health care provider

**Students requiring more care than the school/staff can safely provide need to be at home.**

**The nurse may consult with your physician about his or her recommendations to return your child to class.**



## Emergency Operation Plans

The safety of the students, parents and guests in the schools of Klamath County School District is of the utmost importance and is a priority. For the past couple of years, each facility has been developing an *Emergency Operation Plan* (EOP) based on models from FEMA (*Federal Emergency Management Agency*) and NIMS (*National Incident Management System*). These plans identify potential hazards and disasters that could impact the stakeholders of each facility for a short or long period of time. Plans are in place for events such as fire, earthquake, noxious gas leak, power outages, wind storms, floods and more.

Each facility's EOP has events that could impact them, which might be different for each location since our schools are located in the city, rural areas or in different geographic locations. These active documents are continuing to change to keep updated with contacts, response steps, and add potential new hazards to each facilities plan.

The *Emergency Operation Plan* helps us to plan and prepare for possible events which will disrupt the education process in our schools and recovery as quickly as possible. The process of developing our EOP's help us to establish and practice steps to focus on the safety of our student, staff and guests. If you have questions on the EOP for a specific facility, you should contact the Principal or facility Supervisor with your questions.

If it is necessary to dismiss school early due to bad weather or other emergencies, announcements will be made on the same radio and television stations periodically throughout the day and posted on our district website as soon as a decision is made.

**Our first line of communication will be through the One Call Now system. Please make sure that the school(s) your student(s) attend have your current contact information in the system.**

**Please do not telephone the stations, the school, or the school district office.** Arrangements have been made with the stations to broadcast the information to you.

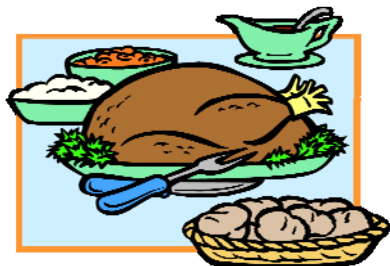
