### School:

Lost River Jr/Sr High School serves grades 7 -12 with a current enrollment of approximately 220 students. The school, which is part of the Klamath County School District in Southeastern Oregon, is located in rural farm country with students coming from the communities of Merrill and Malin. The student body is approximately 58% Hispanic and 42% Caucasian. The school provides free breakfast and lunch to all students under the School Meals Community Eligibility Provision, which allows schools with high poverty rates to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students.

### Curriculum:

The academic program at Lost River is organized on a seven period day with 52 minute class periods. The school offers a variety of dual credit options through Klamath Community College and Oregon Institute of Technology. Current dual credit courses include: Writing 121, Writing 122, Speech 111, Math 111, Chemistry 104, Animal Science 121, History 203, Psychology 201, Criminal Justice 101 – 103, and Welding 101. In addition students have the option of completing college online classes provided through Klamath Community College.

### Grading:

A - Excellent	90-100	4

### Grade Point Average:

GPA is computed using the above quality points to produce unweighted GPAs. A minimum of 24 credits are required for graduation. In addition seniors must successfully complete a senior project presentation and senior portfolio that includes 40 hours of community service.

### Diploma Options:

Lost River Jr/Sr High School awards honor's diplomas in addition to standard diplomas and modified diplomas. The valedictorian and salutatorian must be honor's diploma recipients.

### Post High School Placement:

- Approximately 50% of graduating seniors in 2015-2018 enrolled in a community college upon graduation.
- Approximately 35% of seniors in 2015-2018 matriculated directly to 4-year colleges.
- Approximately 15% of seniors in 2015-2018 selected work or military service.
