Your child has expressed a desire to become a member of a Klamath County School District activity program. The staff and administration of the district feel the following may be helpful to you. Please read this information carefully with your child, sign and return to the school.

1. Students involved in any KCSDD sponsored activity are expected to adhere to the following eligibility requirements: OSAA eligibility is determined from the prior semester's grades - all students must currently be enrolled in and passing five (5) classes, and be on track for graduation (for OSAA activities);. KCSDD eligibility requires that all students be in regular attendance, maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) and receives no F's during any KCSDD grading period.
2. All members are expected to conform to the rules of eligibility and participation as prescribed by the Oregon School Activities Association (for OSAA activities), Klamath County School District, and the activity program.
3. A student must pay a \$25 (9-12) activity fee. No student will be able to participate until this fee is paid or cleared through the school office. Specific activity programs may require additional fees.
4. Unless pre-arranged by school administration an athlete will not be allowed to participate in practice or contest if absent from school during any part of the day or participate in practice or athletic contest scheduled for a non-school day if absent for any part of the previously scheduled school day.
5. It is understood the Klamath County School District is not liable for any medical, dental, or hospital bills occurring as a result of injuries incurred by a student while participating in a supervised activity and that such bills, in excess of insurance benefits, shall be the responsibility of the student's parents or guardians.
6. Each student will be held monetarily accountable for school equipment issued as part of participation.
7. A student will not be allowed to participate in activities until all fees/equipment from a previous year is cleared by the school office.
8. Each member must possess a student activity card in grades 9-12.
9. Students involved in both athletics and activities and found in violation of either alcohol/drug and tobacco policy, will have consequences incurred to both athletics and activities.

KCSD Illegal Drug, Alcohol, and Tobacco Policy

Klamath County School District has made the following decisions and consequences regarding the use of illegal drugs, including alcoholic beverages and tobacco, during the KCSD Activity Calendar year (July 1-June 30).

Klamath County students participating in Klamath County School District activities shall not possess, use, transmit, or be under the influence of illegal drugs, or alcohol, of any kind, nor shall the participant have in his/her possession any paraphernalia associated with the above during the KCSD activity calendar year. Participants will be found in violation of this policy if they are not personally using, but remain in the presence of individuals who are violating this policy. Any infraction occurring during the KCSD activity calendar year (July 1 – June 30) will result in consequences being enforced upon the conclusion of a due process meeting between the school administration, the student, and parents/guardians. The student may become ineligible to receive awards or letters for the activity. Participants who find themselves in jeopardy because of a substance abuse problem should receive professional assistance. Participation in the Education Awareness Option Program is strongly recommended for students who are found in violation of this policy. KCSD schools will be expected to participate in a front-end education component that will be required for all perspective students participating in activities under this policy.

I USE AND/OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL DRUGS OR ALCOHOL

a. First Offense

- i. The student will be suspended for one calendar year from activity programs.

AND/OR EDUCATIONAL AWARENESS OPTION (EAO)

An Educational Awareness Option is available for first offense Use and/or Possession of Illegal Drugs or Alcohol violations only. A student and parent, or adult advocate, may opt to successfully complete a KCSD provided EAO, or other approved alcohol or drug educational program. Upon successful completion of the program and after review by the advisor and principal, the student's eligibility may be reinstated.

Educational Awareness Option will consist of the following:

The school administration will inform the student and parents/guardian of the **Educational Awareness Option** Program. The student needs to choose this option within five (5) calendar days upon the conclusion of a due process meeting between the school administration, the student, and parents/guardians.

- The student, with a parent or an adult advocate, will be required to complete all **Educational Awareness Option** sessions.
- Upon successful completion of the **Educational Awareness Option**, the student and the parent or adult advocate will be required to meet with the advisor and school administration. The purpose of the meeting is to plan for continued assistance for the student. The meeting must take place prior to reinstatement.
- Students who choose this option will be suspended from competition for a minimum of 30 calendar days. If the Educational Awareness Option Program exceeds 30 calendar days the student will be expected to successfully complete the **Educational Awareness Option Program**.
- Students not choosing the **Educational Awareness Option** will be suspended for one calendar year.
- Suspension may carry from one activity season into the next in which the student participates.
- The student will be able to attend meetings during the suspension.
- The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations before being permitted to rejoin the activity program.
- Any costs outside the KCSD approved programs will be the responsibility of the parent.

- ii. The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the Activity program.

b. Second Offense

- i. The student will be fully suspended from the activity program for a period of one calendar year.
- ii. The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the activity program.

c. Third Offense

- i. The student will become ineligible for activity involvement for the remainder of their high school career.

II ATTENDING PLACES WHERE ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES ARE OCCURRING

Students shall not remain at any site where unlawful activities such as consumption of illegal drugs or alcohol by minors are occurring

a. First Offense

- i. The student will be suspended until the end of the current school year.

AND/OR EDUCATIONAL AWARENESS OPTION (EAO)

An Educational Awareness Option is available for first offense violations only. A student and parent, or adult advocate, may opt to successfully complete a KCS D provided EAO, or other approved alcohol or drug educational program. Upon successful completion of the program and after review by the advisor and principal, the student's eligibility may be reinstated.

Educational Awareness Option will consist of the following:

The school administration will inform the student and parents/guardian of the **Educational Awareness Option** Program. The student needs to choose this option within five (5) calendar days upon the conclusion of a due process meeting between the school administration, the student, and parents/guardians.

- The student, with a parent or an adult advocate, will be required to complete all **Educational Awareness Option** sessions.
 - Upon successful completion of the **Educational Awareness Option**, the student and the parent or adult advocate will be required to meet with the advisor and school administration. The purpose of the meeting is to plan for continued assistance for the student. The meeting must take place prior to reinstatement.
 - Students who choose this option will be suspended from competition for a minimum of 15 calendar days. If the Educational Awareness Option Program exceeds 15 calendar days the student will be expected to successfully complete the **Educational Awareness Option Program**.
 - Students not choosing the **Educational Awareness Option** will be suspended until the end of the school year.
 - Suspension may carry from one activity season into the next in which the student participates.
 - The student will be able to attend meetings during the suspension.
 - The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations before being permitted to rejoin the activity program.
 - Any costs outside the KCS D approved programs will be the responsibility of the parent.
- ii. The student will be able to participate in meetings but not attend competitions until successful completion of the EAO.
 - iii. The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the activity program.

b. Second Offense

- i. The student will be suspended for one calendar year from activity programs.

ACTIVITIES TOBACCO POLICY

Klamath County School District has made the following decision and consequences regarding the use of tobacco during the Klamath County School District activity calendar year.

III USE AND/OR POSSESSION OF TOBACCO

a. First Offense

- i. Immediate suspension from the Activity pending decision by school administration. Decision will be determined after reviewing the facts and consultation with the Activity advisor.
- ii. The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the Activity program.

b. Second Offense

- i. The student will be suspended until the end of the activity year.
- ii. The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the Activity program.

c. Third Offense

- i. The student will be fully suspended from the activity program for a period of one calendar year.
- ii. The student may become ineligible to receive awards or letters for the activity.
