Title 1A School

- Title 1 is a part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.
- It is United States Government's largest education assistance program for schools.
- In 1994, the emphasis was shifted to help disadvantaged children meet the rigorous state academic standards. Funds are used to provide programs to help children who are struggling in reading and math.
- Extra help (in addition to what they learn during math and reading time in the classroom)
- Funding provided under ESEA (Elementary & Secondary Education Act)

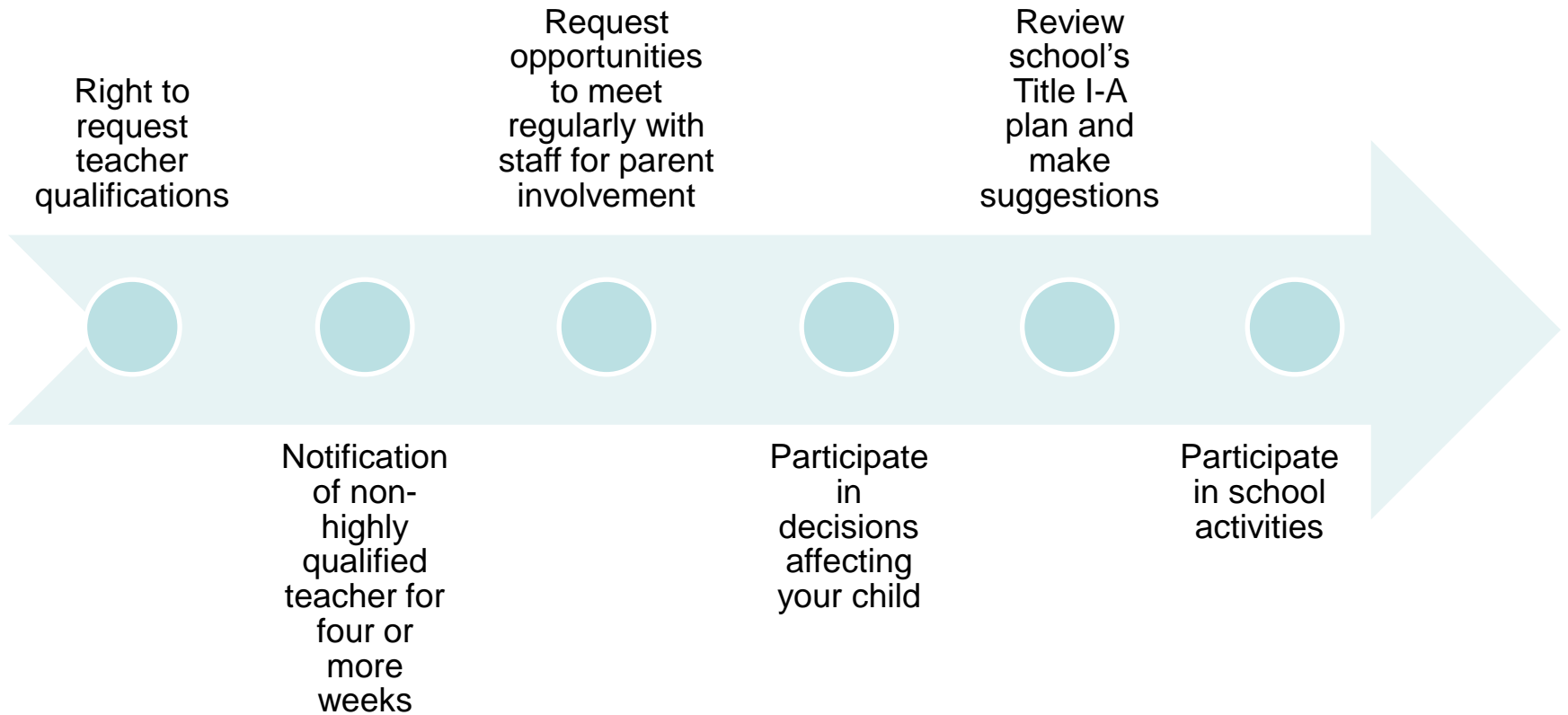

Curriculum Changes in Education

Oregon State Standards

- 2013-14 OAKS test.
- Indicates whether students have the basic skills to work a minimum wage job.



Common Core National Standards

- Beginning last year (2014-15) students were assessed.
- Smarter Balance test.
- **Increase in rigor.**
- Indicates whether students are prepared to meet the academic requirements of college.

Assessments & Monitoring

- Assessments our school uses:
 - OAKS / SMARTER Balanced, DIBELS, Star Reading/Math, MobyMax
- Notification of your child's assessment results
 - OAKS: Annually, reports sent home or distributed at conferences
 - Other: DIBELS
- Progress monitoring process in reading & math
