HENLEY MIDDLE SCHOOL ELECTIVE & EXPLORATORY COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ABOVE & BEYOND

The class will cover the power of citizenship, the tools of academics, and the necessary skills to be a successful student and member of society so you can reach your full potential for the future. You will be able to achieve "above and beyond" what you thought were your abilities and learn the skills necessary for success as a person both in and out of the classroom. Students who are not involved in Choir or Band will be placed in Above & Beyond. We offer subject specific A&B for those students who may need assistance in either Math or Reading/Written Language, and we offer General Study Skills A&B for students not requiring subject specific assistance.

ART & CONSUMER STUDIES

WORLD OF FOOD: Try out some ethnic dishes and sample foods both familiar and new to you. Come expand your knowledge of the wide world of our food choices. [J2749]

FOOD & FAMILY: Students will learn about the relationship between food and good health. They will make foods that consider cost, time, and family appeal. Students will be encouraged to earn some credit for this class in their own kitchen at home and share their skills with their family. [J2748]

ART STORIES: This class covers the evolution of animation through History from Paleolithic cave paintings to animated feature films. Students will explore animation by constructing projects including a zoetrope, flipbook, and claymation figures. We will be viewing and discussing historically significant animated feature films like Gertie the Dinosaur (1914) to present day animated films. [J2712]

ART (Jr): Introduction to art with primary focus on watercolors. [J2750]

CREATIVE PROJECTS: In Creative Projects students will choose individual projects from a variety of ideas. Some of these might include, latch hook, scrap booking, sewing small projects for the home, fabric photo frames, polar fleece snowbands, etc. [J2730]

MUSIC

JAZZ BAND: This class provides instrumental music students the opportunity to learn to perform jazz literature in the jazz band ensemble setting. Students will learn to interpret and play music in different jazz styles and perform for others. **Auditions are required.** **THIS IS A FULL YEAR CLASS.** [J2275]

MATH

YOU SOLVE IT: A course in creative problem solving. Students are asked to think and work together to construct catapults, parachutes, and towers of toothpicks and other interesting devices. [J2753]

MATH LAB: Students will work on developing and strengthening math skills related to grade level math standards using math games, online math game sites such as ixl.com and mathplayground.com [J2157]

LANGUAGE ARTS

CREATIVE WRITING: The study and practice of poetry, short stories, journals, biographies and drama. [J2057]

BRAIN GAMES: A class that uses fun games, puzzles, and video to explain how we use our different senses and why we react the way we do to certain situations. [J2722]

BOOK CLUB: The class will read a book of the teacher's choice and have class discussion, use audio-visual aids, make projects and play games to better understand the content of the book. [J2727]

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

ATHLETIC SKILL DEV: This course is designed to develop strength, agility and balance. Activities will include fitness and exercise, strengthening and conditioning to increase students' fitness levels. Students will walk to the H.S. with our Health/P.E. teacher for this class. [J2709]

ATHLETIC GAMES: In this class students will participate in competitive games including pool, ping pong, dodgeball, volleyball, and others. Sportsmanship and team playing will be emphasized. [J2710]

VOLLEYBALL: Students will have the opportunity to improve and further develop their skills through games, drills, and competition. Sportsmanship and team concepts will also be emphasized. [J2708]

FITNESS: Student will be engaged in an upbeat fitness program. They will be improving health and wellness. Lost body fat, increase muscles, learn fitness and moves for lifelong fitness.

Students will progressively get better as each workout allows room for improvement.

There will be a fit test. We will base our improvement on that amongst other possible methods.

BASKETBALL: Students will have the opportunity to improve their basketball skills through games and competitions. Sportsmanship and team concepts will be emphasized. [J2707]

RECREATIONAL SPORTS & ACTIVITIES

INTRO TO ARCHERY: This class will enable students to learn the fundamentals, skills, procedures and safe handling of equipment in archery. [J2738]

GOLF: Students will develop and demonstrate skills and knowledge of the game of golf. They will learn the proper etiquette and safety factors involved. The skills will be demonstrated in team play situations and at Shield Crest Golf Course. **Fee is charged for this course.** [J2706]

INTRO TO HUNTING: Students will learn the history of hunting practices and a breakdown of hunting certain species. [J2735]

COMEDY & MORE: Watch funny classic comedic videos and learn what is funny and how to deliver jokes. Possibility of creating a 2 minute stand-up routine. [J2713]

BOARD GAMES: This class will cover rules, strategies, and playing classic board games. Monopoly, chess, and others will be used to challenge students mentally. Our final project will be to design a board game as a group including rules, strategies and all game pieces. [J2742]

COMIC BOOK PROJECTS: This class gives an overview of popular comic book characters. We study them and eventually design an original character and make an original comic book. [J2737]

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

SCIENCE FICTION LITERATURE: Students will explore the world of Science Fiction literature much like a book club. The class will read books of the teacher's choice and have class discussions using audio-visual aids, make projects and play games related to science fiction. [J2745]

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY: Using Lego or Fischer Technik kits, the students create and design models to solve problems. Students learn about structures, energy transfer, machines and computer control systems. They also create and design robots. [J2718]

ROBOTICS: Students trace the history and development of robotics. They learn about structures, energy transfer, machines and computer control systems. They also create and design robots. [J2719]

SOCIAL SCIENCE

LEADERSHIP: Students will be given the opportunity to learn skills that will help them to organize and implement student activities for Henley Middle School. These activities may include dances, assemblies, fund raising, community service, and other educational projects designed to teach students effective community leadership. Goals for the course will include teaching student organizational skills for good peer relations, instruction in budgeting and fiscal responsibility. **(8th Graders only – may not be offered as 7th period – may be covered in specific Guide Room)** [J2734]

YEARBOOK: Students will be involved in designing the theme of the school yearbook, take pictures at school events and help with the yearbook layout. **(8th Graders ONLY – may not be offered as 7th period choice – may be covered in technology elective)** [J2758]
