



### School Environment


#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

#### ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



### Academic Success


#### ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.




#### FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

### School Goals

Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School has 3 key goals for the 2024-2025 school year:

- Increase the percentage of students on track to graduate through constant monitoring and individual academic plans
- Decrease the number of students that are chronically absent through regular reviewing of data and individual attendance plans
- Increase academic growth in both ELA and Math through the increase of rigor and study skills in all classes

### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School has taken multiple steps to make the school both safe and welcoming. We have modified vulnerable exterior doors to make the school secure at all times. We have also installed a video monitored locked main entrance to limit unauthorized access to the school. We updated our school camera system including doubling the number of cameras. Staff has continued implementing character strong development activities to improve the climate and culture of Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School. Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School continues to follow precautions in order to keep students and staff safe and healthy.

### About Our School

#### ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School offered college and high school dual credit options in writing. Students were able to take online classes through Klamath Community College for dual credit.

#### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School offers Career and Technical Education courses in Business, Woods, Metals, and Manufacturing.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We offer athletics at both high school and junior high levels. Students can participate in MESA (Science and Math), student leadership, tutoring, CHS art, mountain biking, and OHSU On Track internships.

#### PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Chiloquin Jr/Sr High School offers opportunities for parent and community input through annual Title I and monthly Title VI meetings. Other opportunities for parent involvement are Parent/Teacher Conferences, Open House, Family Nights, and Senior Presentations. Students go out into the community for service projects and various community clean-up days.
